	The proposal seeks to make technical and corrective amendments to the <i>Public Sector Act 2022</i> . The amendments will validate:
	 the role two former Police Commissioners performed as chief executive of the Queensland Police Service (QPS) and one former Fire Commissioner performed as acting chief executive of the then Queensland Fire and Emergency Services (QFES);
	 acts or omissions done by these former Commissioners, or their delegates, in the capacity as chief executive, if the acts or omissions would have been valid and lawful had the arrangements relied upon to perform the role of chief executive been valid; and
Regulatory proposals where no RIA is required	 things done or omitted to be done by others who had relied upon the validity of decisions made or actions taken by these former Commissioners in the role of chief executive.
	The amendments will declare that the relevant Minister had the power to appoint the former Fire Commissioner to act as the chief executive of the then Queensland Fire and Emergency Services (QFES) for the period from 1 November 2013 to 30 June 2014.
	The amendments are not intended to alter the fairness of former decisions or past actions.
	The amendments do not impose direct costs on businesses or the community or increase their regulatory burden.



These amendments involve amendments to address technical errors and do not require regulatory impact analysis under the Better Regulation Policy.
